The syllabus is divided such that 40% syllabus is completed before 1st internal assessment, next 30% before 2nd internal assessment and last 30% before 3rd internal assessment. ? I.T.S Dental College, Hospital and Research Centre has always considered education of students paramount. In addition to the routine classes, college has also introduced Mentor Ward System. In this, on an average, 15 to 20 students are allotted to one particular faculty. The college always strives to take education to the next level. Keeping this in mind, newer ways of teaching and mentoring are always scoped. A Feedback system was introduced by the college for all the students. Feedback was recorded from the students on various parameters. The primary question asked is the student's overall satisfaction from the college. Being a premier teaching institute, the students are also asked if they are satisfied with the academic knowledge of their faculty and how it is imparted to them. The general code of conduct and behavior of the faculty are also taken into consideration. Students are also asked their opinion on the upkeep of the infrastructure of the hostel and mess, the quality of food and the behavior of the mess workers. The ambience and quality of food available in the canteen too are points for feedback. The students are asked their opinion about the infrastructure of the institute and the teaching methods employed. The infrastructure of individual departments is also discussed. The college drives a paperless (green campaign) in the campus. Feedback for the same is also recorded.
